

# Eligibility & Participation

Children eligible for admission are dependent children ranging in age from six weeks to five years of age of Wounded Warriors, active duty military personnel, DoD civilian personnel paid with either APF or NAF, reservists/guard on orders, mobilized Guard/Reserve on orders, surviving spouse combat related, DoD Contractors, Federal Retirees, and inactive/guard reserve. Register for care on Military Childcare.com. Care is based on a priority system.

# Types of Care

## Full Time Care

All enrolled children are considered full-time. Your space is for you to use during our regular open hours.

## Hourly Care

Hourly care is available on a space available basis. The cost of hourly care is \$5.00 per hour or any part of an hour per child. Reservations are for times between the hours of 0615-1730, however children may not be dropped off between the hours of 1200-1400. Payment for hourly care is due upon pick up of your child.



# 2019 Fees

Fees for full time care are on a sliding fee schedule with nine categories based on Total Family Income. To estimate your fees please use the chart below. Proof of your family's Total Family Income (active duty current LES and/or civilian pay statement) will be required upon enrolment. If you have more than one child, the older child(ren) will receive a 10% discount.
